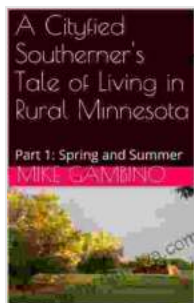
I've also learned a lot about rural Minnesota. I've learned that it's a beautiful place, with rolling hills, sparkling lakes, and endless forests. I've learned

If you're thinking about making a change in your life, I encourage you to do it. Step outside of your comfort zone and try something new. You never know what you might discover.



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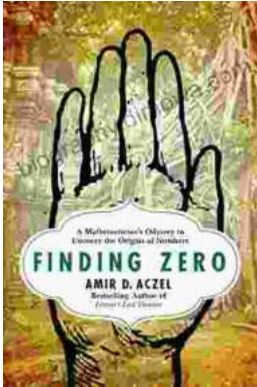
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
