


James Bronterre O'Brien: The Chartist

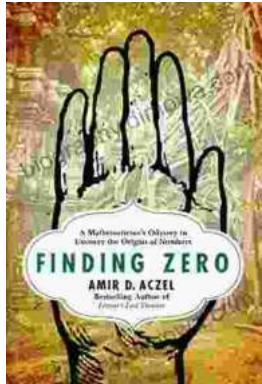
